

Overview of the GPMHSC quality assurance assessment process

The General Practice Mental Health Standards Collaboration (GPMHSC) quality assurance program demonstrates our commitment to providing GPs with high-quality general practice education and training in mental health.

The GPMHSC Committee meet to discuss the quality assurance assessment (QAA) of a selected activity.

The Committee advises the Secretariat on provision of commendation, or feedback for improving the activity according to the GPMHSC Standards, and will advise the training provider in writing within five business days.

Training provider agrees to implement the advised actions to amend and rectify the activity according to the GPMHSC Standards.

The training provider has the right to request a review of decision. This must be in the form of a written response and submitted to the Secretariat within seven business days. The written response will be included for discussion in the agenda for the next Committee meeting.

Training provider continues to deliver training and accreditation status remains unchanged.

The Committee considers review of decision request and advises training provider of their considerations in writing.

The QAA process is now complete.

Training provider does not agree to implement the advised actions to amend and rectify the activity according to the GPMHSC Standards.

Accreditation status of the activity changes to be withdrawn. GP participants attending future activities are not eligible for GPMHSC accreditation.

The GPMHSC reserves the right to withdraw accreditation of activity.
